

OTAMATEA HIGH SCHOOL UNIFORM

The grey shorts, trousers and skirts may be worn in 2016/2017, with the new uniform compulsory by 2018. White and grey polo shirts may also be worn in 2016 with button up blue shirt/blouse being compulsory from 2017.

The jersey and/or jacket (with school logo) are available for all students.

Years 7 - 12

- Blouse: Button-up blue blouse/shirt with school logo
 Jersey: Royal blue V-neck jersey with school logo
Choose between shorts, trousers or skirt
 Shorts: Black polyester viscose blend with school logo
 Trousers: Black polyester viscose blend with school logo
 Skirt: Black pleated skirt polyester viscose blend with school logo
 Hose: Black opaque tights or black pantihose – with shoes only
 Socks: Plain black socks
 Shoes: Plain, black covered polishable shoes (no high tops), black soles and flat heels or fully black sandal with one back strap eg: slave sandals or black roman sandals
 Jacket: Navy blue OHS monogrammed showerproof jacket
 Hats: School regulation beanie or cap. Caps and beanies must not be worn inside
 Hair: Natural hair colours only
 Scarves: School regulation scarf only. Must not be worn inside.
 Jewellery: No jewellery except watches, plain gold or silver studs (one per ear only), one flat signet ring. No facial piercing. Taonga if worn must not be visible.



Year 13 Dress Uniform

- ¾ sleeve white blouse or long sleeve white shirt
 Black skirt or trousers with school logo
 Plain black cardigan or black jacket
 Plain, black covered polishable shoes (no high tops), black soles and flat heels, fully black sandal with one back strap eg: slave sandals or black roman sandals.
 School tie (purchased from school).



Mufti Day / Year 13 Dress Code

ACCEPTABLE

- T Shirts, Polo shirts, Button up shirts
- Skirts that are no shorter than regulation uniform skirts
- Board shorts
- Long trousers
- Hats/Beanies (not to be worn in class)
- Sneakers, sandals, flat shoes

NOT ACCEPTABLE

- Short or extremely tight shorts and skirts, low cut or see through tops
- Clothing promoting drugs (including alcohol & cigarettes), inappropriate language and gang related clothing
- Low riding or visible 'jocks' or 'boxers'
- Backless dresses



PE Uniform

- Whanau coloured regulation Tee-shirt. (Whatua - red, Ngapuhi - yellow, Maniapoto - blue, Arawa - green).
- Plain black shorts.
- Togs (rash shirt optional) for swimming.

School Blazer:

- A school blazer is available for Year 11-13 students and students who represent the school's premier teams.
- Available from Paparoa Drapery.

Prefect Uniform:

- Prefects are issued with their uniform prior to taking up their leadership role.

Extras:

- School regulation navy caps, grey beanies, multi striped scarves and school tie. All these items are available through the school office.
- Tee-shirts, singlets, thermal (white only) must not be seen if worn under uniform items. Outer garments will cover all other garments.

All uniform items are to be named, kept clean and in good repair.

All students must be in school uniform. If they have a note from their parent/caregiver excusing them for short term variations they may be directed to the Uniform Exchange where non-uniform items will be exchanged for a uniform item, on loan.
